 - "**River Stories**" - Stories about a Japanese river ogre, Pecos Bill, and wetland animals.

- **Wednesday, July 14 at 2 pm**
 - "**Frog Tales**"- Charming tales about our amphibian friends featuring Mark Twain's "The Celebrated Jumping Frog of Calaveras County".

- **Wednesday, July 21 at 2 pm**
 - "**Oceans of Fun**" - A Lewis Carroll poem coupled with Russian & Korean folktales celebrate life on and in the sea.

- **Wednesday, July 28 at 2 pm**
 - "**Wonders of Water**" - American and European stories about the importance of water.

- **Wednesday, August 4 at 2 pm**
 - "**Make a Splash!**" - Hawaiian, African, and Jewish tales about characters who "make a splash."

- **Wednesday, August 11 at 2 pm**
 - "**The Rhine's Gold**" - This family-friendly, storytelling version of Wagner's "Das Rheingold" includes orchestral excerpts from the opera.
